- 'tis the season for holiday planning. The gathering of family and friends, crowded parties and travel may put everyone at increased risk for COVID-19. The CDC recommends that you carefully consider the risk of spreading if you're having an in person holiday celebration.
- The more people you interact with during the gathering and the longer the interaction lasts, the higher the risk of getting infected.


Before gathering

- Check whether the host has steps in place to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- Bring extra supplies like extra masks, tissues, and alcohol based sanitizer.
- Avoid contact with people outside of your household for 14 days before gathering.
- Remember to stay home if you don't feel well or are at a higher risk for serious complications from COVID-19.

During gatherings

- Maintain a distance of at least 6 feet from people you don't live with and mindful in areas where it
 may be harder to do so, such as restrooms and eating areas.
- Wear a mask at all times when around people who don't live in your household.
- Limit contact with commonly touched surfaces or shared items.
- Wash your hands often with soap n water. If soap n water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
